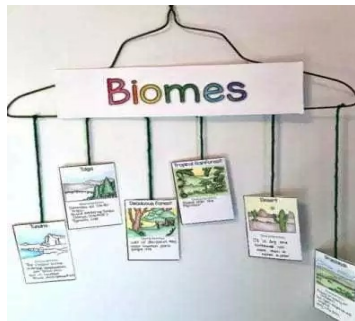
Benny and Penny in Lost and Found By: Geoffrey Hayes
